
## **PAVILION OF TOGETHERNESS**

The project is divided into three segments, each different than the other. It starts as a closed, introvert space that begins to open its walls as you walk down the deck, slowly transitioning from a secluded to a gradually exposed space. The only element balancing the continuous change in the wall's transparency is the consistent wooden deck. Freed from any exquisite furniture the pavilion fully embraces foldable seatings which can be easily tucked away. It offers multiple possibilities of usage depending on the users needs, such as: small scale exhibitions, daily picnics or evening socializations, children's plays and many more. It is a space for everyone; friends, family, individuals and animals as well. The pavilion is a well balanced installation that corresponds with its surrounding through its shape and with the environment through its material. The open deck invites you to climb aboard and walk through the transparent pavilion. The material used is in direct contact with the materials of the region, it is a natural element that is warm and inviting. The project does not obstruct the existing location, yet it adapts and improves it, serving as an image within an image or a garden within a graden. Its an object implanted in the very heart of the village thus being accessible from many directions. The composition lets you walk freely around the pavilion, through it and within it with no obstacles to stop your movement.
